ORDINANCE NO. 22-15

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OR DISPOSAL OF CERTAIN
SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY**

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the President and Board of Trustees, the following described personal property is no longer necessary or useful to, or for the best interests of, the Village of Forest View:

1. Eighteen (18) Nortel Network Model T7316E Charcoal Phones
2. Eight (8) Avaya Model T7316E Charcoal Phones

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF FOREST VIEW, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS IN THE EXERCISE OF THE VILLAGE’S HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the above-described personal property is declared as surplus and the Village Administrator is hereby directed to sell or dispose of said personal property. It is expressly understood that such sale of the personal property shall be conditioned on payment in full by cash or certified check, and that said personal property is sold in an “as is” condition, with the Village specifically disavowing any and all expressed or implied warranties.

SECTION 2: This ordinance and each of its terms shall be the effective legislative act of a home rule municipality without regard to whether such ordinance should (a)

contain terms contrary to the provisions of current or subsequent non-preemptive state law, or (b) legislate in a manner or regarding a matter not delegated to municipalities by state law. It is the intent of the corporate authorities of the Village of Forest View that to the extent that the terms of this ordinance should be inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, that this ordinance shall supersede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
