Officer Rivera is the K-9 handler for the Forest View Police Department. Since K9 Officer Rivera and K9 Ali were placed in service on August 5th 2018, after K9 Officer Rivera attended six weeks of training. On August 5th, 2018 K9 Officer Rivera and K9 Ali were placed in service. As an industry standard for training, K9 Officer Rivera and K9 Ali attend two (2) 8 hour training days per month with Full Circle K9 Solutions for maintenance training. During their training sessions they receive scenario base training, as well as training in narcotics vehicle and room searches, tracking, article/evidence search and recovery, and obedience. The following were the deployments that K9 Officer Rivera and K9 Ali were involved in for 2018.

- Requested by the Cicero Police Department in the 'sniff' of lockers at their High Schools for narcotics.
- Requested by Riverside PD for the search for two subjects that fled on foot from a vehicle where a firearm was recovered.
- Requested by MCAT to assist Lyons PD with the search of 3 vehicles for the presents of narcotics.

- Requested by Broadview PD for the search of an armed subject who fled from a disturbance.
- Requested by Forest View PD to assist with the search for subjects that fled on foot from a stolen vehicle and were wanted for the burglary to the Tool Store.
- Requested by MCAT to assist Brookfield PD with the search of vehicles on traffic stops for narcotics.
- Requested by MCAT to assist Lyons PD with a search warrant of a residence where a shooting occurred for other subjects possibly hiding in the residence.

K9 Officer Rivera continues to develop his skills as a canine handler within law enforcement. We look forward to assist and provide an invaluable service to community and law enforcement with our K9 unit.
